




#### The Main S.T.A.Y. Shelter

- An alternative to your traditional adult shelter, with only 4 beds, 2 male and 2 female.

#### **Transitional Living Program**

#### **Harrison House of the Desert**









- ▶ The purpose of the Street Outreach program through Operation SafeHouse, is to increase youth safety and self-sufficiency for homeless and at-risk youth ages 11-21.

What's Up SafeHouse, our new downloadable App, provides free, anonymous text-communication, from 7am to 11pm with a licensed mental health professional from SafeHouse.



# Supporting Runaway Youth through the McKinney-Vento Program

## Definition of Homelessness: McKinney-Vento Act\* (42 U.S.C. § 11434a(2))

- Children or youth
  - who lack a fixed, regular, and adequate nighttime residence
  - ▶ NO minimum income requirement
  - No age limit
  - ▶ No time Limit
- Includes youth sharing housing due to loss of housing, economic hardship or similar reason
- Living in hotel, motel, trailer park or campground due to lack of alternative housing
- Living in emergency or transitional shelters
- Children or youth with a primary nighttime residence that is a public place not designed as a sleeping accommodation for human beings
- Children or youth living in cars, parks, public places, abandoned buildings, bus or train stations or similar situations
- Migratory children who qualify because the children live in the circumstance described above



#### What is Fixed, Regular and Adequate?

- Fixed housing
  - ▶ Is not easily moved
  - ▶ If student is in a residence that is fixed, that means the home is not moving such as a motor home, trailer, or car
- Regular Housing
  - ► Student stays at the same place every night
  - If student is in a residence that is regular, they are not hopping from home to home daily, weekly, or on a monthly basis
- Adequate Housing
  - Living conditions provide basic needs such as running water, electricity, heat, and safe living conditions without overcrowding
  - ▶ If student has adequate housing, they will have their own bed or bedroom, their own space with privacy, heat, water, and electricity.



#### Unaccompanied Minor or Unhoused Youth

- Youth and children not in <u>physical custody</u> of their parent or guardian
  - ► No age limits
  - ► Eligibility is based on current housing situation
  - Includes pushed out and runaway youth
  - An offer to return home, but they declined, does not make them ineligible
- Unaccompanied status alone, does not make them homeless. We must look at the entire situation
  - ► Is housing fixed, regular and adequate?
  - Current living situation even if youth currently has housing
  - Examples...



#### Rights of Youth that Qualify...

- ▶ Remain in School of Origin. The school the student
  - attended when permanently housed
  - most recently attended
  - was most connected to within last 15 months
- Immediate enrollment; including attending classes and participating fully (42 U.S.C. § 11434a(1)) even if
  - ▶ the student lacks appropriate records such as immunization records, proof of residency, prior school records, etc
  - ▶ The student has a history of absences or outstanding fines/fees
- Automatically eligible for free meal program and not required to complete application.
  - Meals should begin on day of enrollment.
- ► Transportation to remove barriers to enroll in and attend school, including extra curricular activities (42 U.S.C. §11432(g)(4)(A))
  - Remains until the end of the school year in which they obtain permanent housing



#### High School Aged Youth

- Partial Credit recovery from prior schools
- If youth transfers schools after second year of high school, he/she becomes eligible for **Graduation Credit Waiver** 
  - ► Graduate with CA's minimum credit requirements (AB 1806)
- Individualized information and counseling regarding college readiness, college selection, applying for school, financial aid (FAFSA) and on-campus supports
- Unaccompanied youth must be assisted with FAFSA Verification of homelessness to be eligible for independent student status for maximum financial aid for college.



#### How Can I Help a Youth?

- ► All school districts are required to have a McKinney Vento Liaison, serve students through high school graduation.
